



Goals

The purpose of Salvation Army camping is to serve the needs of the camper. Physical, social, and spiritual. To meet social needs the camp provides an opportunity for each camper to contribute and receive from a community living experience. The aim is to help campers make their own right decisions, stimulate creativity and foster independence. To nurture campers spiritually they are encouraged to seek God through His creation and daily devotional times.

Fees

Our fees are designed so every family can afford Camp Wonderland. The total cost will vary according to location and can be determined only through contacting your local Salvation Army representative.

Emergency Contacts

In the case of illness or injury it may become necessary for your child to leave camp early. Be sure that the names and phone numbers for your **emergency contacts are correct** and in operation in the event that we cannot reach you, this information becomes extremely important. If you will be out of town during your child's camp stay, please provide the camp with a phone number where you can be reached.

Early Departure

In the event that you need to pick up your child early from camp, please call in advance. We will only release campers to the parent or guardian listed on the application. An exception will be made with a letter from the parent/guardian indicating the individual's name and their relationship to the camper. In either case, the individual will need to show photo identification.

Facility

Children are assigned to 12 cabins according to age and gender. Each cabin houses 18 campers, 2 counselors and 1 junior counselor. The camp accommodates 216 children each week.

Staff

The culturally diverse Christian staff dedicates each day to supervising your child and ensuring that the camp is both safe and fun. Staff members are well trained college and high school students who are committed to providing a quality camping experience for every boy and girl.

Each activity is led by a qualified instructor and supervised by the cabin counselors. All camp activities have been deemed appropriate and safe for our camper population. Each camper will have the opportunity to participate in the following activities:



Program Areas

Crafts - our craft lodge is filled with a variety of materials to give campers an opportunity to express their creativity

Hikes - emphasizes environmental awareness. Provides opportunities for hikes and nature activities as well as learning to care for animals.

Native American Village - camp has a simulated Native American village complete with teepees and campfire. Campers learn about Native American life through stories, crafts, and carrying out.

Recreation - we offer a variety of sport activities including soccer, volleyball, basketball, softball, and kickball. Teamwork and good sportsmanship are emphasized. Several playgrounds are available.

Visitors

If you would like to visit camp prior to your child attending, you may arrange a tour by calling **(781) 784-5934**. We do not recommend that you plan a visit while your child is attending camp. This is likely to spark homesickness.

Office Hours

Our telephone facilities do not allow for campers to call home or receive phone calls. In the case of **emergency**, please call the camp office at **(781) 784-5934**.

Lost and Found Clothing

There is so much activity going on at camp that children often misplace clothing in various locations. If the clothing is clearly marked with your child's name, our staff will make every effort to return it to the proper owner. We recommend the following:

- check clothing list in application packet
- label child's clothes and belongings
- appropriate clothes for outdoor activities

Orientation - through the outdoor living skills campers can experience compass, first-aid, hiking, and overnight camping in tents at our pleasure site. compatible with campfires and marshmallows!

Ropes Course - a certified installed ropes course to help build self-esteem and promote trust.

Water Activities - our camp is set on Lake Massabesic and offers swimming activities as well as boating. Certified lifeguards & boat instructor are part of our waterfront staff.

Waterfront - is open each day with items such as candy, snacks and beverages. Camp, pottery, and memorabilia can be purchased using the order form available from your sending unit. This merchandise will be distributed to the camper prior to departure.

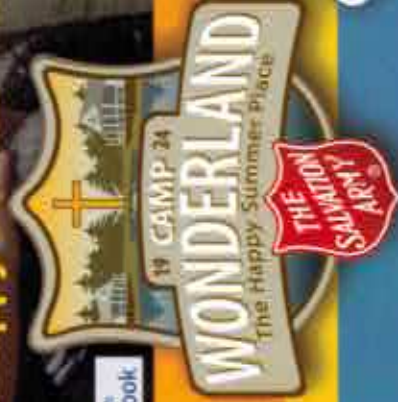
