The Northern Long Eared Bat and the reason for their endangerment:

According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Northern Long-Eared Bat, a bat species native to New England, was recently listed as <u>Endangered</u>. They face a significant obstacle that has caused a gyk loss in population over the last ten years, known as <u>White-Bogs Syndroms</u>, which appears as a white fungus on the bat's nose. It has been seen to infect and later kill got of each hibernaculum.

I know what you might be thinking, didn't COVID-19 start from a disease from a bat? Thankfully, White-Niose Syndrome cannot infect a human or most other species because our body temperature is much higher than the temperature the fungi can survive in. The technical cause of death for bats infected with WNS is star-wation, not the disease itself. When the bats hibernate and their body temperature is lower than usual, it becomes easier for WNS to infect them. Once infected, the bats wake up much more frequently, which uses up their energy and causes star-wation before leaving hibernation. Smaller species with similarly lower body temperatures can also be infected, so preventing the disease from apreading further is crimical.

This particular species, the Northern Long-Eared bat, hibernates in caves during the winter. Because of Newburyport's historical past, there are many tunnels beneath us, meaning it is highly likely that these bats exist there. The Eastern Railroad, which ran underneath Newburyport in the rith century, has been abandoned for many years.
