


Creating a Culture of Belonging



Building Access Control

Locked Doors

All doors are locked after arrival and monitored throughout the day by maintenance and administrative staff.

Video Intercom

All guests are asked to identify self and who they are coming to see before entering the building.

Staff FOB system

All staff use a FOB to enter and exit buildings, protecting access and providing us with an ongoing record of who is in the building.

Raptor System

All guests will sign in and out using a picture ID. Raptor System runs a quick background check then prints a visitor badge with photo. Guests also check out through the system. RAPTOR TECHNOLOGIES

Video Camera Systems

All buildings have video camera systems overseen by the Director of Facilities.

Walkie-talkies


Administrators and designated staff have high quality walkie-talkies.

All staff are responsible for making sure doors stay locked at all times--this is part of our culture of safety.

ALICE a solution of Navigate 360

ALICE Training is a list of options that can be used to stay safe in the event of a violent intruder. Some may choose to **Evacuate** and some may choose to **Lockdown** and barricade. Others may choose to **Counter** if an armed intruder is able to enter the space they are in. ALICE Training[®] is about options. Not every situation is the same. Alert and Inform are critical communication pieces that will aid those who have to make life saving decisions.

Developmentally Appropriate

Administrators and teachers work collaboratively to create student lessons that are age-appropriate.

"I am not scared, I am prepared"

Using this theme and a small group discussion approach, students hear an empowering message and are able to ask questions and share feelings in a supportive environment.

Reinforce "see something, say something" culture

The ALICE trainings reinforce the overall approach to creating a culture of belonging. If a student is concerned about their own or another person's safety and security, we encourage them to reach out to a trusted adult.
