Community

Newburyport is a suburban residential, seacoast community located 35 miles northeast of Boston in Essex County. One of the smallest cities in the Commonwealth, per USCB 2020 census data, Newburyport continues to have a relatively stable population of 18,197. The city's historical architecture is well known, particularly the restored commercial district and residential district along High Street, which features fine examples of Federal architecture. The well-developed cultural and artistic aspects of the city are highlighted by a live theater space and numerous galleries. Fine restaurants, shopping, entertainment, and the natural beauty of the waterfront combine to make Newburyport a wonderful place for residents, and a supportive environment for education.

School

Newburyport High School is a public, comprehensive four-year school, accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. The 2022-2023 school enrollment is 820 students, 9th through 12th grades. Newburyport High School is currently operating a three day five period rotational schedule. Teaching staff is provided with ongoing in-service training through Effective Teacher Training to assist them in employing active learning strategies in the classroom. More than half the teaching staff has earned advanced degrees in their disciplines.

Credits and Graduation Requirements

Students need a minimum total of 110 credits in grades 9-12 to graduate and must successfully complete the subjects included in the Core Curriculum. Semester courses yield 2.5 credits each semester. Each year, students are required to take thirteen (14) semester courses.

Covid Statement

NHS, like all Massachusetts public schools closed on March 13, 2020, and commenced full remote learning. We adopted the following grading scale for Spring 2020:

<u>CE - Credit Exceeded</u>. Student went above and beyond the minimum expectations for course credit. Student met the expectations of all assignments. Work from before the closure can be considered by the teacher. Students had the opportunity to submit work they had missed by May 1, to help with their final credit rating.

<u>CR - Credit Received</u>. Student completed enough work and attended enough courses to receive credit for the class. Students has submitted most of the assignments during closure and has made progress towards the expectations of assignments and can resubmit. Work from before the closure can be considered by the teacher. Students had the opportunity to submit work they had missed by May 1, to help with their final credit rating.


<u>NC – No Credit</u>. Student received no credit for the course. Student has submitted less than 50% of assignments during the closure and/or has not turned in assignments, or work submitted is not in line with expectations. NHS wants all students to earn credits. For students that did not earn credit a plan was set up to help students achieve the credit for the class.

None of these grades impacted student GPA's. Graduation requirements have remained unchanged, however some students may have had to change or drop a course. For impacted students, their counselor can explain in detail on the students' letter of recommendation.

NHS students did not have an opportunity to participate in athletics or any extra-curricular club or group activities from March - June 2020

Dual Enrollment

Newburyport High School defines Dual Enrollment coruses as: Courses taken at a 2 or 4 year accreditied college (online or on site) where the student earns credit at the high school and the college. A 3 credit course would typically equate to 5 credits at Newburyport High School. Students may register for these courses with approval.

In addition to our daily curriculum NHS offers courses through Virtual High School (<u>www.govhs.org</u>). Students also have the opportunity to take "Credits Beyond the School Day", courses which are taken outside of the traditional school day.
