STUDENT RECOGNITION:

Superintendent Sean Gallagher introduced Isaac Zeller, Bresnahan 3rd grader and commended him for his commitment to participating in the *Recess Running Club* for three years, running 68.1 miles since 2017. Isaac received a standing ovation from all those in attendance.

STAFF RECOGNITION:

Principals for all schools introduced and commended teacher leaders from the various schools.

NHS STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORT:

NHS Student Representative Peter D'Ambrosio reported on the following events from NHS:

 Advisory Program - We have completely revised the Advisory Program to focus on two areas. Provide a structured time for students to reflect and plan for after High School, and to give an avenue for student voice on school and community issues.

- Student Council During the September Advisory each room nominated students to serve as representatives on the council. The first meeting was held this past Thursday. Areas of focus were redefining of Valedictorian and Salutatorian now that class rank is not an issue, and class-only grade level dances. The Student Council is now a very good representation of student voice.
- College and Financial Aid Night This past Wednesday the guidance department held a
 college information night which involved over 50 schools and organizations. The
 Merrimack Workforce Investment Board was also present and was able to provide
 information on the trending jobs in Massachusetts, as well as provide paths for students
 to find internships relative to interests.
- Student Leadership This school year the high school has partnered with two organizations to help with student leadership development. The first is Essential Partners which has worked with communities, organizations and schools to foster cultures that embrace differences through constructive dialogue. They will be training 30 students and 11 teachers in the skills of constructive dialogue. All trained students and teachers will be able to practice their skills by facilitating our community dialogue around defining Valedictorian and Salutatorian. The second organization is the Anti-Defamation League who will be training students at the Middle School and High School. The Peer Training program equips students to lead their peers in dialogue around respecting and valuing differences.

Mayor Holaday asked if someone has to apply for these programs. Answer - Yes **Sean Reardon** asked if they will present to the School Council then to the School Committee. Answer - yes

LATER START TIMES DRAFT - PRESENTATION:

Superintendent Gallagher outlined and explained the Later Start Times Draft Presentation. With feedback from all stakeholders they developed a draft plan that addresses major concerns in a proactive way.

- Transportation: consolidate routes to 3 locations utilizing the same number of buses. This approach would be cost neutral for the district.
- Bresnahan School would keep the current arrival/dismissal schedule.
- Proposal: Revise the Nock/Middle schedule so both schools would have the same arrival/dismissal schedule.
- Proposed NHS dismissal time of 2:45 or 2:50 PM will not interfere and/or would have little impact on the athletic program. The CAL Superintendents & Athletic Directors approved afternoon start times of 4:00/4:15 PM similar to other late start schools.

David Hochheiser said there were a lot of pieces to juggle.

Bruce Menin said there may be additional costs, but not on buses. There might be costs within schools to help schools adjust. Next step - community presentation.

SUPERINTENDENT'S CONTRACTUAL SALARY:

Bruce Menin explained that the School Committee had voted to award **Superintendent Gallagher** a 3% raise, but **Superintendent Gallagher** expressed his desire to accept a 2% raise. Therefore a vote must be taken regarding this issue.

David Hochheiser said they had talked about curriculum.

Sean Reardon spoke regarding data base - tie it back into what we are doing - he would like to see an action plan.

ASS'T SUPERINTENDENT ANGELA BIK'S REPORT:

Assistant Superintendent Angela Bik recognized three district leaders – Alissa Gallegos, Kathy Hill and Jamie Sokolowski. She explained the Early Literacy Program - the goal of 90% of students reading at grade level k-5.

David Hochheiser inquired why we were choosing these programs.
