VAPING FORUM

Superintendent Sean Gallagher addressed the audience and gave an overview of the seriousness of the vaping problem. He explained that they were lucky to have the three speakers here tonight who have done extensive research into this problem that is affecting teenagers in our schools. A question and answer session followed the presentations. The three speakers were Dr. Cynthia Grondin, Dr. Gary Gastman, and Cathy Riccio, Supervisor of Health.

Dr. Cynthia Grondin, Research Scientist spoke regarding Vaping and Disease Risks: Uncovering the Connections. Her presentation explained the various vaping devices, what chemicals are involved, the Comparative Toxicogenomics Database and the Disease Risks. She explained in detail how vapor is changed as it enters the body into many harmful chemicals that affect the human body in detrimental ways. One Juul pod is equal in nicotine to that in a pack of cigarettes 59mg/ml.

Dr. Gary Gastman, spoke next regarding Link House, a Center for Behavioral Health and Addiction Treatment Services. Their mission is to provide the tools to maintain long-term recovery. They provide the following:

- Outpatient and group counseling
- Assessment and referral
- Medication management
- Recovery coach services
- Addition prevention, treatment and advocacy
- Professional training and community education

Cathy Riccio, BSN MS MSN Supervisor of Health, etc. spoke regarding the seriousness of the vaping problem. She spoke of the issues facing students and the steps that they can take if they become embroiled in the vaping problem.

A panel of local educators, three speakers, police and others were empaneled and a question and answer period was done. Panelists were: Dr. Grondin, Dr. Gastman, Cathy Riccio, Andy Wulf (NHS Principal), Mike Testa (NHS Ass't Principal), Sue Anderson (NHS School Nurse), Lisa Furlong (Nock Principal), Meg Tierney (Police Officer), and Frank Giacalone (Nwbpt Director of Public Health). Questions from the audience that had been written down and turned in were addressed to the various members of the panel.

Superintendent Gallagher closed the forum by thanking all those involved for their hard work and research into this most serious problem.
