






Early College Cost



The Early College Rate is:

- \$115 per credit MA resident/\$128 per credit NH resident
 - > 3 credit course costs \$345-MA resident/\$384-NH resident
 - > 4 credit course costs \$460-MA resident/\$512-NH resident
- Books/materials are bought separately
 Student bills may include imbedded books/materials fees
